

A NOTE FROM THE BOARD PRESIDENT

Our new lawn service day will be on Wednesday going forward. The landscaping crews did a good job beginning the clean up and shaping of bushes, shrubs and out of control vegetation in and around the property. With a few exceptions the crews worked without interference from residents. These workers are trying to do their job and while you are telling them how to do that job, nothing is getting done and we are paying for "your version" of their job. We must remember that the common areas of the village are from buildings out and are the responsibly of the association. The Board approves plantings to owners who request such, but owners are responsible to maintain plantings per our documents, if not the association will maintain per documents. In the few incidents of resident interference there was a common theme, " I was told it was ok to ignore the documents and plant what I want and don't worry about it". I assure you this is not acceptable. If you are in this group, I understand your displeasure with the cutting of some of your plants, etc., however your displeasure should be directed to the person who " gave you permission to ignore our documents". I personally checked all such claims and found there was no evidence of Board permission on any of the claims. Please remember to submit your request before you plant. If there is any questions, consult your documents and speak to the Board member assigned to your unit.

During the first two weeks of June cleaning of dryer vents will be done. More info will be out to you as we get closer.

Just a reminder, per the medical experts, it is okay for vaccinated folks to meet without masks and social distancing of 3ft. not 6ft.

It is a Pinellas County government program that works with an individual's (or family's) insurance plan to cover 100 percent of expenses associated with deductibles and copayments and 50% of cost for medically necessary transport that is denied coverage by your insurance. RAINTREE VILLAGE BOARD OF DIRECTORS Minutes of Meeting of Tuesday, April 20, 2021

Call to Order and Roll Call:

The regular meeting of the Board of Directors was held on Tuesday, April 20, 2021 at the clubhouse. President Dan Cottle opened the meeting at 7:00 p.m. Vice President Betty McClure, Treasurer Barbara Masson, and Directors Ralph Memoli, Deedee Street, and Chuck Sambol were present. Secretary to the Board Carol Machael was present. Manager Bob Kelly was present. The meeting had been posted in accordance with Florida statutes; a quorum was noted.

Review/Approval of Minutes

The minutes of the March meeting were approved after having waived the reading with a motion by Sambol, second by Memoli; unanimous. Minutes had been distributed to the Board members at least 48 hours in advance of the meeting.

Reports

<u>Tenant Owner Committee Report –</u> In the absence of Lucy Tirabassi, Dan Cottle reported that one interview was held for a new tenant, two units were for sale, and about six units were vacant and not for sale. It was also mentioned that Richard Blake's wife had recently passed away and also Michele Caputo in 606.

<u>Treasurer's Report</u> – Barbara Masson

The delinquent account for Unit #705 has been settled and income of \$5041.27 has been paid.

<u>Grounds/Landscaping Committee –</u> Cottle reported in the absence of Richard Blake. The lawn service company has done the first part of the perimeter and trimmed inside. Several residents "told landscapers how to do their job" and RTV must pay for the extra time of the lawn service pros who bill for hours spent. Cottle asked that residents allow landscapers to do their job uninterrupted.

<u>Building Maintenance</u> – Dan Cottle reported that only 4-5 work orders remain unfinished. He mentioned that the copper plumbing pipes can be corroded by the surrounding cement and may develop small holes; this is due to the age of the buildings. If hissing is heard, tenants are asked to turn off the water, call the building rep ASAP so that repairs can be made before too much damage occurs. This has occurred in 605 and may be present in another unit. A delay in acting may result in worse damage and more expense. Dol-Fan Construction works in RTV when a full day of work is present; if only a small amount of work is present, there is a wait until the next time a full day of work is present.

<u>Bob Kelly from Ameritech</u> – He stated that he meets each Monday for check signing and to assist with issues that arise, and that residents are welcome to attend.

- a. Request by #2705 to enclose the lanai, with all required documents present. Moved by Masson to approve, seconded by Street; unanimous.
- b. Request by #1102 to install bronze colored screen doors, front and back. Moved to approve by McClure, seconded by Street; unanimous.
- c. Request by #804 to widen drive by 3 feet to accommodate wheelchair access in and out of vehicle. Following discussion motion was made by McClure to approve patio block due to requirement for green spaces and when no longer needed or house is sold the block would be removed and area resodded by owner; seconded by Street; unanimous.

Announcements /Audience Comments


McClure asked when clubhouse would be opened. After discussion it was determined that clubhouse could be used as before and that appropriate safety precautions should be taken.


Adjournment
