As we are entering the cooler and drier months please follow city of Clearwater watering guidelines. If you have a watering system please use it wisely. I remind you of this as we are on pace to pay \$181,000.00 for water, sewer and trash. This amount is more than \$11,000.00 over what was budgeted and next year will bring a increase in rates from the city. Always be on alert for leaky faucets, running toilets, etc. If you are not sure, call your building representative, Mark, or myself to check it out. This is one of the few items in the budget we can control. Thank you for your cooperation in this matter.

Trees will be trimmed in the upcoming months (October and/or November) and will include branches off roofs, removal of dead trees, and palms. As soon as we get a date we will pass it along.

If your garage door needs repair, PLEASE call Overhead Door Company for repairs. As the Association is responsible for this expense DO NOT CALL PRECISION DOOR, they are extremely overpriced, almost double. If you need a new unit Home Depot or Lowe's sells them and will install also at a reasonable price.

## RAINTREE VILLAGE BOARD OF DIRECTORS Minutes of Meeting of Tuesday, September 21, 2021

### Call to Order and Roll Call:

The regular meeting of the Board of Directors was held on Tuesday, September 21, 2021, at the clubhouse. President Dan Cottle opened the meeting at 7:00 pm. Vice President Betty McClure and Directors DeeDee Street, Ralph Memoli, Chuck Sambol, Barbara Masson, Sherri Fiore and Manager Bob Kelly were present. Secretary to the Board Carol Machael was on vacation, fill-in Ruth Cottle took the minutes for Carol. The meeting had been posted in accordance with Florida statutes; a quorum was noted.

## **Review/Approval of Minutes**

Minutes had been distributed to the Board members at least 48 hours in advance of the meeting. Minutes of the August meeting were approved after having waived the reading with a motion by Sambol, seconded by Memoli, passed unanimously.

#### Reports

<u>Tenant Owner Committee Report</u> – Lucy Tirabassi reported that there no interviews held. Three units are unoccupied and not for sale.

<u>Treasurer's Report</u> - Mike Dugan was on vacation therefore Dan Cottle read the Treasurer's report. Income \$52,470, with operating expenses of \$38,563. Monies added to the Reserves: Painting \$717, Roofing \$6,167, Termites \$167, Tree Trimming \$166, resulting in total operating expenses of \$45,780, giving us a new balance of \$6,689. Operating bank account was \$143,352 less insurance accrual of \$106,322 leaves available operating funds \$37,030. Delinquencies totaled \$641 and Dan was told most of those should be cleared up by now.

<u>Grounds/Landscaping Report</u> - Sambol reported delays in the landscaper's schedule was caused by the many rain days we had in the past month. Sambol stated he would be checking the Village to get ready to schedule another clean up. Also, he was looking to spruce up the west entrance. He is going to get advice on what to put there with little or no maintenance required type plants. A resident mentioned the sign needs to be touched up with paint so Chuck will also take a look at that.

<u>Building Maintenance</u> – Cottle and Mark met with Tim from Murray Tree Service and will be scheduling a day next month to remove the branches from the rooftops and 3 dead trees will be removed. Residents will be informed of the date once set.

Manager Bob Kelly – Attends Monday check signings, discuss current topics, questions on budget draft.

### **Old Business**

Tree removal unit 2006, met with 3 different tree service companies and all determined that the tree is healthy and there is no need to remove the tree. The request to remove was denied. The vote was unanimous.

Resident Mr. Cain had stated in the August meeting that he wanted to clarify statements from the May minutes. The secretary reached out via e-mail to Mr. Cain to invite him to come listen to the minutes from the May meeting regarding his request. Mr. Cain responded he would contact the secretary Carol later in the week to schedule time to listen. Mr. Cain failed to respond, therefore the minutes from the May 2021 meeting will stand as written and his request is denied. Vote was unanimous.

#### **New Business**

Unit 1805 requested 3 windows replaced per RTV specs. Motion to approve Masson, second by Street. Approved 7-0.

#### **Announcements**

Next budget meeting will be October 4<sup>th</sup> at 1 pm.

### Adjournment

Masson moved and Fiori seconded to adjourn the meeting.
